

Consortium Agreement—Student Authorization

A consortium agreement is required in order to receive financial aid for your attendance at another law school as a guest student. A consortium agreement establishes that Wayne State University Law School considers you to be enrolled in an eligible degree program and accepts the credits earned at the "Host" institution as part of your educational program. The WSU Office of Student Financial Aid will be responsible for awarding and disbursing your financial aid.

- Step 1** Complete Section 1. Only required courses or study abroad accepted credits are eligible for federal aid.
Step 2 **Submit this form to the Wayne Law Dean of Students or Director of LLM Studies for completion of Section 2.**
Step 3 Return complete and signed form to the Wayne Law Financial Aid Office.
 • We will FAX a Consortium Agreement to your Host School to obtain confirmation of your enrollment status and cost of attendance figures used to calculate your aid eligibility. Federal guidelines regulate disbursement dates.
Step 4 If requesting loans, funds will be sent directly to you and **you will be responsible for paying any charges incurred at your Host school.**
